

Michel Hamon is honorary Professor of Neuropharmacology and Director of Research at the French '*Institut National de la Santé et de la Recherche Médicale*'. He has created and directed for 24 years (1985-2008) an INSERM research unit devoted to Neuropsychopharmacology at the Faculty of Medicine Pitié-Salpêtrière, and is now in the *Paris Institute for Psychiatry and Neurosciences* at the Ste Anne Psychiatry hospital.

Professor Hamon's research interests and expertise include molecular and cellular mechanisms of action of psychotropic drugs and development of relevant preclinical models for their study. He is also involved in studies on pathophysiological mechanisms underlying chronic neuropathic pain and sleep-wakefulness disorders. He is Associate Member of the French Academy of Medicine and the French Academy of Pharmacy, past-President of the French *Société des Neurosciences* (1999-2001), past-President of the French *Association for Biological Psychiatry and Neuropsychopharmacology* (AFPBN, 2010-2012), and he was chair of the Scientific Programme Committee of 2010-2012 congresses of the European College of Neuropsychopharmacology (ECNP).

He acted for many years as deputy chief editor of the Journal of Neurochemistry, executive editor of Naunyn-Schmiedeberg's Archives of Pharmacology, field editor of the World Journal of Biological Psychiatry and of Clinical Neuropharmacology, and member of the editorial boards of Neuroscience, Synapse, Journal of Receptors and Signal Transduction, European Journal of Pharmacology, Neurochemistry International, Life Sciences, Journal of Neuroscience Research, and a few others. He has published more than 600 original papers in Neurosciences and Neuropsychopharmacology, and edited 6 books. His research has been rewarded by several French and international (US, Canada) prizes, including the 2017 ECNP Neuropsychopharmacology Award.
